Divisional Apiary Guidelines

The Chelmsford Divisional Apiary has been established as a training resource, both in respect of direct teaching and in providing new beekeepers an environment in which to gain experience.

A core of two permanent colonies exists as a primary teaching resource, with capacity for ten additional colonies.

All Colonies

- 1. All apiary hive owners must have a **current membership** with the Chelmsford division membership lapses will result in an immediate request for the removal of colonies
- 2. Available spaces are allocated preferentially to new beekeepers
- 3. Colony tenure lasts until October of the year following placement, other than by separate agreement
- 4. No more than 2 over-wintered colonies per beekeeper
- 5. No current year captured swarms are permitted within the apiary
- 6. All colonies within the apiary may be used for the purposes of training or demonstration
- 7. CBKA Committee reserve the right to inspect colonies if there is any doubt about disease status
- 8. Apiary users are required to carry provided identification when on site
- 9. An apiary fee of £10 is applied to each colony (payable to the Divisional Treasurer)

Established Beekeepers

- Spaces in the apiary may be available if no new beekeepers wish to take advantage of the vacancy
- Established colonies must have been free of disease for 5 years beekeepers who have had EFB/AFB in their colonies in the last 5 years will not be allowed to keep bees on the divisional apiary

General

- Divisional volunteers will monitor the apiary and provide help to new beekeepers on a rota basis
- Vehicular access is generally available 07:30 19:30 seven days a week (bank holidays may vary) Additional access by arrangement
- Dogs are not permitted within the College site
